

DAYS 1 - 3

Pick three in a row to complete each day!

<p>WRITING</p> <p>Write a letter to a leprechaun. Sound out your words. What would you like to ask him?</p>	<p>MATH</p> <p>I see 4 leprechauns in a field. 5 more come to play. How many are there in all? Draw a picture and write an equation.</p>	<p>READING</p>  <p>Click on the story to listen!</p>
<p>MATH</p> <p>Draw and cut out 10 shamrocks. Use them to show different ways to make ten. Write the equation for each way to make 10.</p>	<p>PHONICS</p> <p>Use a green crayon or marker to write 5 pairs of rhyming words. Turn them over and play memory with a buddy!</p>	<p>STEM/SCIENCE</p> <p>Use household items (paper towel tube, tissue box, tooth picks, etc.) to make your own leprechaun trap!</p>
<p>WRITING</p> <p>Draw and write about the steps to catch a leprechaun. What do you do first? Next? Then? Last?</p>	<p>READING</p>  <p>Click on the story to listen, then talk with a grown up about the sequence - what happened first? next? last?</p>	<p>MATH</p> <p>Ask a grown up for some pennies, nickels, or dimes. Practice counting by ones, fives, or tens.</p>

Click on the video to learn about clouds and play a memory game!


WRITING

READING




Click on the story to listen!



Use recycled paper or boxes and simple shapes to create a flower.




WRITING

READING




Click on the story to listen!

Click on the video to learn about frogs vs. toads and then compare/contrast them.


WRITING

READING




Click on the story to listen!
