This week in class, we're reading "The Scholarship Jacket" by Marta Salinas.

"The Scholarship Jacket" is one of the best-known stories by Mexican-American author Marta Salinas. It describes a difficult situation that Marta, a Mexican-American girl from Texas, is faced with. Marta is a straight-A student who has earned the scholarship jacket, but her financial situation – and an unjust school leader – may prevent her from receiving her reward.

As we read, we will be discussing the themes of Justice, Freedom & Equality, Power & Greed, and Prejudice & Discrimination as they relate to the text. We are trying to answer these big questions:

"What is fair?", "Does money buy happiness?", and "How does prejudice emerge?"
